RE: Port of Allyn Redistricting Plan

Dear Mr. McGuire,

Please accept this document as the Port of Allyn's Redistricting Plan as is required by RCW 29A.72.010.

The Port of Allyn will maintain its current Commissioner District boundaries.

The rationale for this decision is as follows: According to Mason County's GIS Department, the population numbers for the entire Port of Allyn territory show a total increase in population of 1,469 people. Of those, 195 came from District 1, which was a 2.35 percent increase. This was the smallest increase of the three Districts. District 2 gained 495 residents and District 3 added 779, for increases of 6.10 and 8.84 percent respectively.

The percentage difference between Districts 2 and 3 is a mere 2.74, which is well under the 5 percent differential the State prefers.

The difference between District 1 and 3 is 6.49 percent – admittedly over the 5 percent. However, District 1 will be expanding within the next 12 months by at least 700 residents – and most likely more than that amount – when the 450 apartments and 250 new homes currently under construction and slated to be built in Belfair are finished. This will give District 1 a total of at least 895 new residents, but keep it within the preferred 5 percent differential between the other two Districts.

As the numbers show, District 2 gained a significant number of new residents, and continues to see increases, with at least 50 new homes either currently under construction, or anticipated to be built by the end of 2023. It is expected that Districts 1 and 2 will end up with a similar number of residents by the end of 2023 and be well within the preferred 5 percent. Additionally, District 3 is increasing in numbers as well, just not as rapidly as the other two are currently. But by the time all three Districts are built out, it is anticipated that they will all reflect similar numbers that fall within the 5 percent differential.
